he Sigatoka River Safari and Off Road Cave Safari team recently underwent First Aid and CPR training in Sigatoka . Conducted by Red Cross Trainer, Julian Tausia, the 2 day training was an eye opener for majority of the staff, particularly the younger team members who were doing the training for the first time.

Twenty year old, Josephine Traill, who is an ATV Driver and Guide for Off Road Cave Safari had this to say about her experience.

"This is the first time for me to learn how to do First Aid and CPR and be taught by someone, previously I've only read notes from the internet and books and what I learn from others but this really has opened my eyes on what I can really do should a situation arise either at work or home, "Josephine said.

Staff were taught how to deal with all sorts of worst case scenarios and were eventually tested to demonstrate their practical skills.

The accounts and office team were also part of the training to ensure that all staff were aware of what to do in case of an emergency either at work or out in the community.

Managing Director, Jay Whyte was pleased with the positive response from his team.

"In an ideal world, we'd hope not to come across any scenario, but I am confident with the fact that should a situation arise each member of our Safari team are equipped with the right skills to tend to such situations, "Jay said.

The training was conducted from January 31-February 4, 2012 and the team are grateful to Red Cross for providing the option of on-site training.
